Rules of origin / List rules	The rules of origin are strongly based on the trade agreement between EU and Japan (generally more generous than PEM Convention).	The rules of origin were taken over „one-to-one“ from the PEM Convention.

Cumulation	Bilateral cumulation with EU and UK origin goods allowed. Diagonal cumulation (processing and trade through) actually not allowed.	Bilateral cumulation with CH and UK origin goods allowed. Diagonal cumulation (processing and trade through) actually allowed for origin goods from: Egypt, Faroe Islands, Georgia, Norway, Iceland, Israel, Northern Macedonia, Tunisia, Ukraine New as of 09.06.2021: EU and TR origin goods allowed if processed in Switzerland.
